

# **HOW TO OBTAIN AN I-20 FORM**

"Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status"

To apply for a student visa (F-1) from the U.S government, you must first apply to New York Language Center and receive an I-20 form which verifies that you will be attending school in the United States. Please note that you <u>MUST</u> enroll in the **Intensive Language Program (20 hours per week)** in order to receive a Form I-20 and send us the following documents:

## 1. Completed and Signed Application Form (Online or PDF)

Register for an Intensive Language Program (20 hours per week) on our website at https://www.nylanguagecenter.com/online-registration-form/ or contact us and we'll email you a **PDF application form.** 

### 2. Initial Fees Payment (by credit card or wire transfer)

- School fees: \$200
- Express mailing fee to ship your I-20 packet: \$105 (You do not need to pay if an I-20 can be picked up at an NYLC branch)
  - \* The tuition is due 2 weeks before the start date.

### 3. Copy of Your Passport – biographic page (valid for at least 6 months)

### 4. Evidence of Financial Support:

- A bank statement which shows the current balance in U.S dollars or local currency to prove financial support of at least:
- \$5,500 for up to 3 months of studies
- \$11,000 for up to 6 months of studies
- \$22,000 for up to 12 months of studies.
  The bank statement must include the account holder's name and the date the account was opened.
- A completed and signed affidavit of support form from each sponsor, if you have a sponsor.
- If the sponsor is a company or private organization: The representative of the company or private organization must prepare a document on the company's letterhead stating that it will be financially responsible for your full tuition and living expenses for the duration of your studies at New York Language Center.

### Recommended documentation:

- A letter from the sponsor's employer, which states the yearly salary and whether the position is permanent or temporary.
- A copy of last year's income tax return, if employed for the past 5 years with the current employer OR copies of income tax returns for the past three years, if more than one employer.
